

# *Letters from the Sands*

## **Manuscript preparation: Field and Lab Reports**

*Letters from the Sands* articles are online only and are not usually peer-reviewed. They are selected by the Editor of the journal and the Editor of Field and Lab Reports on the basis of their interest for the expansion of knowledge for the community and of the innovation of their approach, methods and results in the field of Islamic Archaeology.

The contributions in this section will not be published in the hard copy of the Journal, but they will be held online and they will be fully quotable.

Please follow the guidelines below when creating a manuscript for *Letters from the Sands*. Other pieces of supplementary information (eg. full reports, picture albums, etc) can be linked to the post, but responsibility for the contents of these additional documents will be solely of the authors.

For further references on formatting style of this section, please refer to the Journal guidelines.

### **Structure**

Manuscripts should be structured as follows:

- Article title and author(s)'s name(s) and affiliation(s) (DO NOT include an *About the Author(s)* section)
- Text (DO NOT include an abstract or keywords)
- Acknowledgements
- References
- Figure captions
- Tables
- Supplementary material (to be included as linked documents)

### **Notes**

The use of notes is prohibited in all manuscripts.

### **Word limits**

The word limit for *Letters from the Sands* articles is **1000 words**.

**The word limit MUST include all text.** This includes acknowledgements, references, tables and all figure and table captions. Any submission which substantially exceeds the published word limit may be returned to the author(s).

### **Manuscript file formats**

Please submit the manuscript and all tables as a single text file. Our preferred text format is Microsoft Word (.doc, .docx). If you are unable to provide this format please contact the Editor of Field and Lab Reports ([jose.c.lopez@ucl.ac.uk](mailto:jose.c.lopez@ucl.ac.uk)) for advice.

Figures should be submitted as separate high-quality .jpg/.jpeg or .tif/.tiff files (see below). **DO NOT embed figures in the text of your manuscript.**

### **Image formats and specifications**

Please refer to the general guidelines for specifications on size and resolution of the images.

Use uniform lettering on figures. Maps and plans must include an accurate scale and north point.
