Religions of South Asia (RoSA) publishes research on distinctively South Asian or Indic religious traditions—Buddhist, Hindu, Jaina and Sikh—including developments outside South Asia. It also publishes papers on traditions originating outside the subcontinent—Bahá'í, Christian, Islamic, Jewish and Zoroastrian—which have a significant presence there. It welcomes papers which discuss the confluence of religious cultures and inter-cultural encounters, or which question religious boundaries or the concept of religion itself, in relation to South Asia and the South Asian diaspora.

*RoSA* accepts articles of 5,000–9,000 words, including any footnotes but excluding the list of references. Longer articles will be considered, provided that the length is justified by the contents. Authors should follow the Guidelines for Contributors available on the publisher's website (see below). All articles are subject to anonymous peer review.

From time to time, *RoSA* publishes guest-edited numbers on particular subjects. Convenors of conferences, conference panels or research projects are welcome to approach the Editors with proposals (brodbecksp@cf.ac.uk, dermot@grevatt.f9.co.uk, anna.king@winchester.ac.uk).

*RoSA* publishes reviews of books in its field, from any part of the world. If you are interested in writing reviews for *RoSA*, or in reviewing a particular book, please contact the Reviews Editor (suzannenewcombe@gmail.com). You may also offer a review essay embracing several books, or raising wider issues beyond a particular book.

*RoSA* is a development of the work of the Spalding Symposium on Indian Religions, which has been meeting annually in different places in Great Britain since 1975, and is supported by the Spalding Trust. Some articles, but by no means all, have grown out of papers given at the Symposium. The Symposium and *RoSA* are separate organizations, though many people take part in both.
